Electrical Installation

Dick advised that he had spoken to Daryle Taber & he advised he was hoping to do it sometime in the next month.

Fire Prevention

Dick Tennant opened discussion on the situation of Flying on days of Catastrophic Fire warning.

There was some discussion and it was generally agreed to the recommendation that we should not fly power or electric aircraft on days when this condition exists. Non powered Sailplanes should be the only acceptable aircraft if we really need to fly in 40 degree heat in a 20 knot wind. Days of total fire ban would be a matter for our own consideration. It was also pointed out that we must respect our landlord's feelings on these days.

In an effort to do our part we have had our fire fighting equipment checked & updated or recharged as required. Glen Bennett has donated a small fire extinguisher to be located in at or near the keyboard; this has to be worked out. It was also suggested that on really hot days the back pack should be put out in the pit area. We realise that water isn't much good for putting out a fuel fire, but it would help put out the grassfire that the fuel one may start.
