The Temora Invitational Scale Classic

Haze & I took the caravan over on Thursday & set up at the Airport Van Park which is first class. We started work at the airside gate at 7:00 am on Friday morning checking the competitors in & I went down to the flight line at 8:00 to check in with the other judges

Things slowed a little at that stage as we had a severe cross wind gusting to about 30Kts at times However this didn't put a damper on the static judging side of things & our static judges put the cleaners through the 16 entrants in Masters & Expert categories, but left the flight judges to hope the wind would drop. This was not to occur today.

Saturday we were joined by Dick & Jake Tennant who were to do various tasks including the TX pound.

The wind was marginally better and we did get some flying in during the morning, but at 11:00 the airport was re opened to full size aircraft for 2 hours to enable a display by a Wirraway,

P40 Kittyhawk & the Spitfire to put on a great demo & none of us were put out by that. However by afternoon we had the wind problem back again and flying had to cease.

On Saturday night we all attended a dinner at the Temora RSL Club, where the Spitfire pilot Doug Hamilton gave a great talk on his experiences and background on flying these types of aircraft. He was very down to earth and was happy to answer questions from us at the end of his talk. He was asked what was the scariest thing that happened to him during his career & his answer was "his first solo in a Cessna 172" so that's the type of guy he is.

Sunday greeted us with a pretty strong wind but at least it was blowing straight up the strip. So it was on! No nonsense. We had 30 aircraft And a bit over three rounds to fly off 2 flight lines & thanks to the cooperation of the pilots with the flight line crew we finished just about on time.
